

Guidelines for ordinary passport holding Chinese nationals travelling to India from mainland China only for eligible categories of visa

A. Obtain Visa:

Serial no.	Detailed procedure
1	The intending traveller/visa applicant should download the visa application form available here .
2	<p>i. The applicant has to fill up the form and submit to the Embassy/Consulate concerned, a signed copy of the same with all relevant documents as required for the particular type of visa requested for. Details of the documents are available at https://www.eoibeijing.gov.in/visa-services.php</p> <p>ii. In addition, the applicant will also have to submit an undertaking, the form for which is available at here.</p> <p>iii. The applicant will need to submit the above documents at the Embassy/Consulates' visa counter, together with applicable fees, on any of the working days between 0900 hrs. to 1100 hrs.</p>
3	<p>Once the decision to issue visa is taken by the Embassy/Consulate, an email will be sent to the applicant to provide to the Embassy/Consulate concerned, confirmed air tickets for the flight to India and hard copy of Negative test report for RT-PCR, conducted not earlier than 96 hours before undertaking the journey, for getting the visa affixed on the passport.</p> <p>The test can only be conducted at authorised Chinese Government test centres recognised by the Embassy/Consulates of India in China. At present, EOI Beijing recognises testing centres listed out at http://gjzwfw.www.gov.cn/fwmh/healthCode/indexNucleic.do. The test report should be on an A4 sized paper; be in the English language or be accompanied by an English translation, both of which need to carry signature and office stamp of the doctor/Head of the testing centre whose official details should be clearly indicated in English; and bear the serial or registration number issued by the Chinese Government to the testing hospital/lab. The test report should mention the name, gender, birth date and passport number of the applicants as well as the various indicators of the RT-PCR test, showing negative test result.</p>
4	<p>IMPORTANT ADVICE</p> <p>The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare of India has prescribed health and quarantine regulations to be observed by all international travellers arriving in India, which can be found here. All travellers are advised to study, familiarise themselves with and observe these guidelines as applicable. Passengers should ensure, in particular, that they fill the necessary self declaration forms and provide the necessary undertaking etc. well in advance of their travel.</p>
